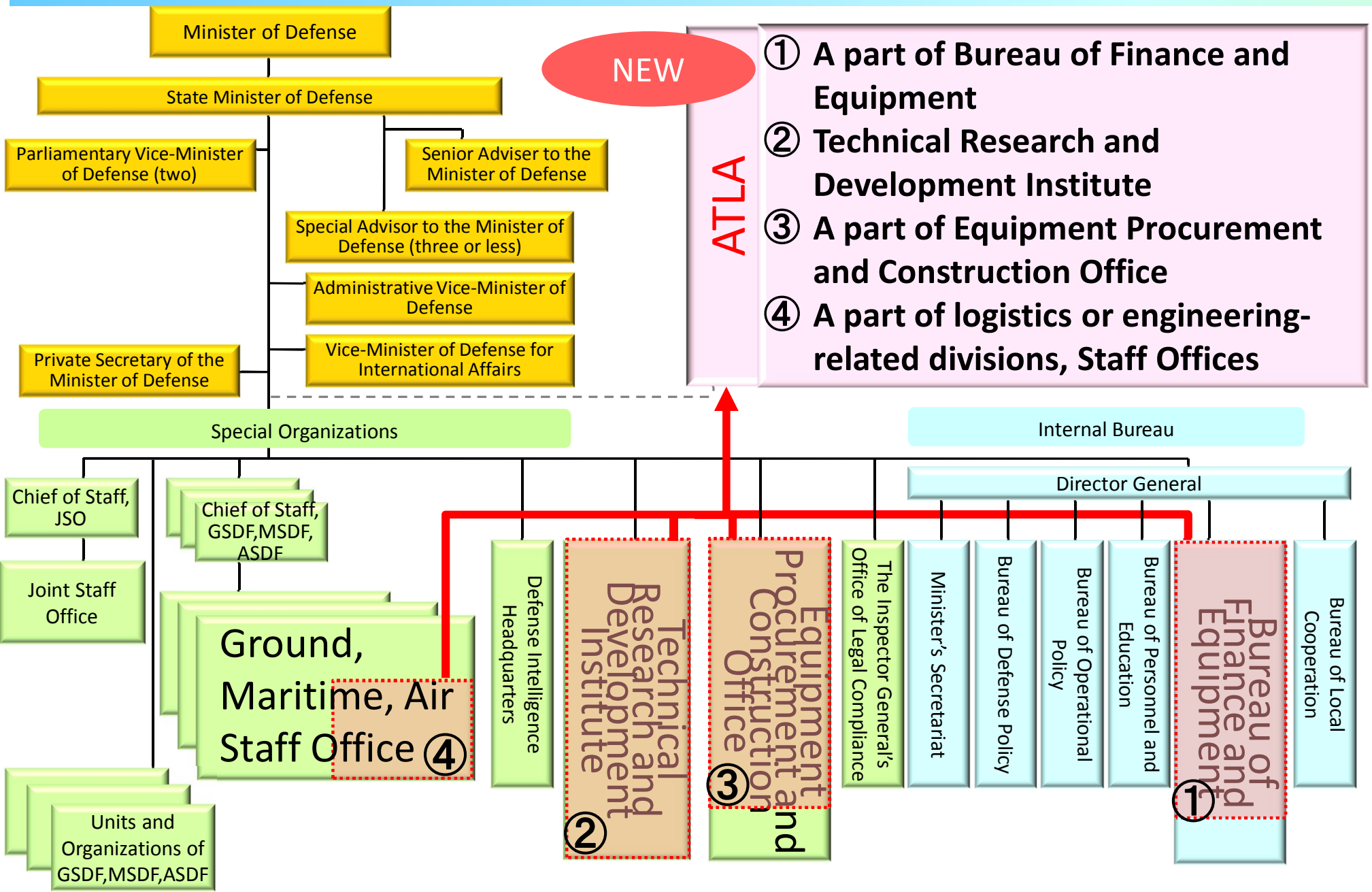

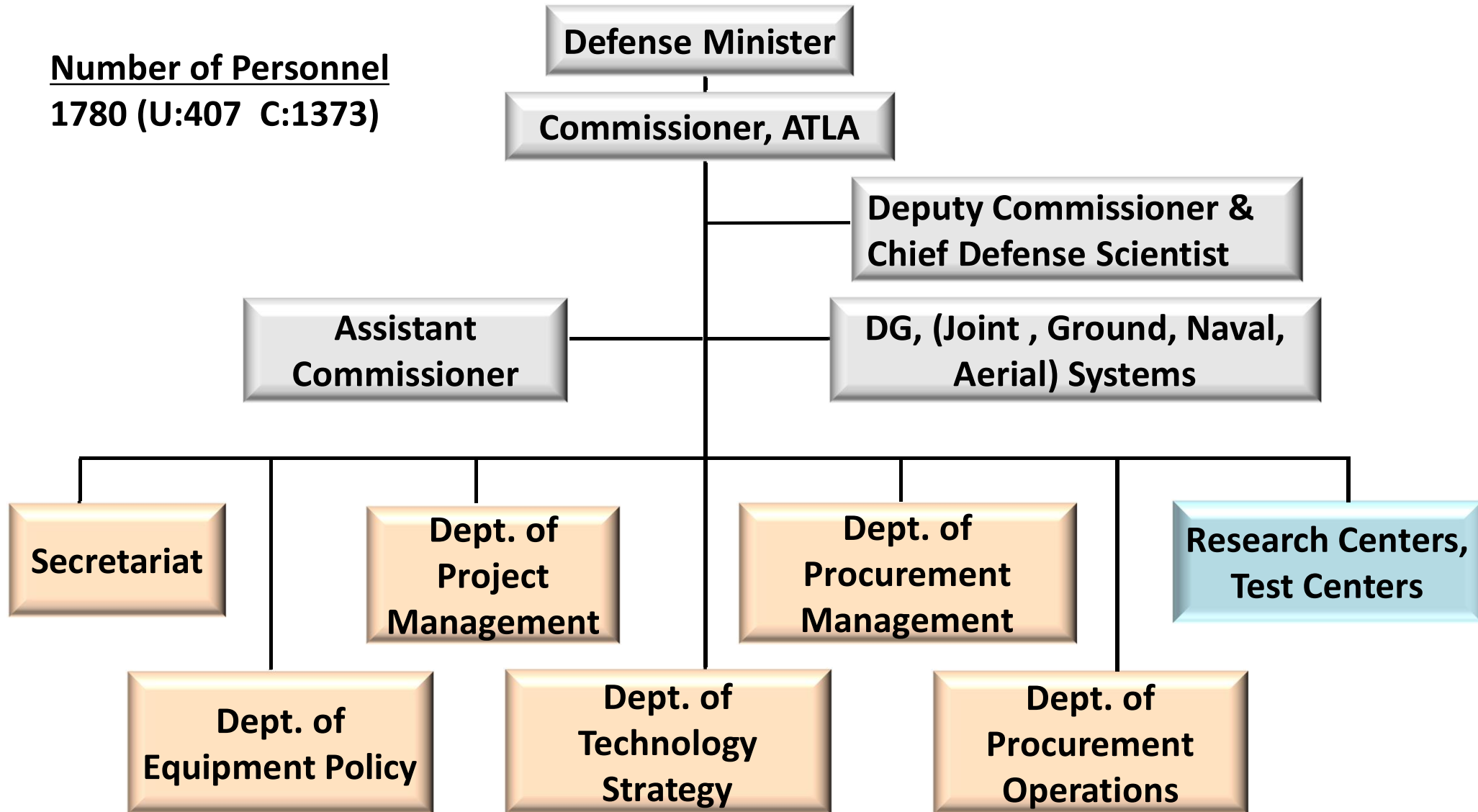

Functions integrated into ATLA



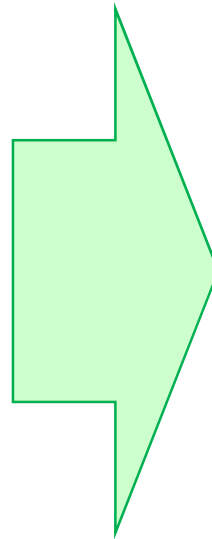
Number of Personnel

① R&D

- Studying how other countries develop advanced technology and R&D strategy
- Cooperation with universities and research institutions

② Project Management

- Increasing in quantity (UH-X etc)
- Increasing in quality
 - Ensuring consistency throughout all phases
 - Enhancing analysis on alternative measures
 - Collecting and supplying domestic and overseas information
 - Being Involved in drafting the specifications
- Forming a organizational base
- Enhancing assistance system to the Minister

③ International Defense Equipment Cooperation

- Enhancing strategic function
- Negotiation/discussion/coordination with foreign countries
- Examining and improving a system to transfer equipment to overseas
- Controlling highly sensitive technology
- Reorganizing overseas bases

④ Defense Industry and Technological Bases
