Intermittent Lecturers Defense Program Management and Defense Contract Management

Graduate School of Business and Public Policy Naval Postgraduate School

The Graduate School of Business and Public Policy (GSBPP) at the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) seeks applicants for various intermittent lecturers for both in-person and online acquisition program and contract management-related courses. Intermittent refers to a work schedule that is less than full-time and is scheduled irregularly to meet specific instructional tasks or deliverables. The duration of employment is dependent on continuous external funding, and could terminate on a short notice.

Successful candidates will be responsible for teaching graduate courses in our MBA and the M.S. programs on an as-needed basis. Applicants should have completed an advanced degree in relevant disciplines such as business administration, public administration, public policy, or a related field. The successful candidate will teach two to four courses per year, as needed.

In-person, resident, courses are taught on the NPS campus in Monterey, CA. Online courses may be taught from distant locations, and duty location is negotiable upon selection.

We are accepting applications now for immediate review of qualified candidates. Teaching assignments for successful applicants may begin as early as April 2019.

NPS offers competitive compensation with salaries that are commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Minimum qualifications:

- Significant defense acquisition program or contract management experience and expertise (e.g., acquisition program manager, warranted contracting officer).
- DAWIA Level III certification in Program Management or Contract Management.
- Ability to teach defense acquisition program or contract management and related courses.
- A graduate degree in a management-related discipline.
- U.S. citizenship

Preferred qualifications:

• Proven teaching effectiveness.

- PMI certification in project management (e.g., PMP) or NCMA certification in contract management (CPCM, CFCM).
- Doctoral degree in a management-related discipline from an accredited institution.

NPS is the nation's premier defense related graduate university. The GSBPP has over 70 fulltime faculty and about 300 full-time graduate students, most of whom are military officers, and approximately 300 distant learning students (military officers and Department of Defense civilian employees).
