CAPT Wang was born in Hong Kong and grew up in Seattle, Washington. He received his commission in 1988 through the NROTC program at the University of Washington where he received a Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Political Science. He holds a Doctor of Jurisprudence (JD) degree from the University of the Pacific, McGeorge School of Law (1995) and a Master of Arts (MA) in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College (2008). He is also a graduate of the Defense Institute of Security Assistance Management and the Defense Language Institute (Tagalog).

CAPT Wang began his career as a Surface Warfare Officer and had blended assignments in the active and reserve components. As a Surface Warfare Officer, he served aboard the USS FLETCHER (DD-992) as the Communications Officer and the Main Propulsion Assistant. As a reserve component SWO, he served with Mobile Undersea Warfare Unit 104 in San Jose, CA and the Naval Control of Shipping Unit 120 in Tacoma, Washington. CAPT Wang performed three significant extended active duty periods to include USPACOM Legislative Affairs (1995), and with COMSEVENTHFLT as JTF Exercise Planner (1996-1997) and Assistant Logistics Operations Planner (1999).

As an FAO, his tours included serving as the first full-time Officer Community Manager (OCM) for the community at BUPERS-3 in Millington, TN from 2009-2011. He was the Military Associate Dean of the School of International Graduate Studies (SIGS) at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, CA from 2011-2013. From 2014-2017, CAPT Wang was the Senior Defense Official/ Defense and Naval Attaché in Singapore. He served as the Assistant Chief of Staff for Strategy and Engagements at US Seventh Fleet from 2017-2019.
