The Prevention, Relief & Recovery (PR&R) program at the Center for Civil-Military Relations (CCMR) is a practitioner-oriented teaching and engagement institute that conducts courses, workshops, and capacity-building activities in the domains of conflict management, conflict recovery, disaster management, and governance. In addition to our faculty, PR&R teaching teams regularly incorporate guest speakers or former field-practitioners from relevant organizations such as UNOCHA, IOM, USAID/OFDA, ICRC, UNHCR, US Military, US Customs and Border Protection, and the private sector.



Annual In-Residence Courses

Governance Offered every February

MASL P170024 – Defense Governance

This course examines the fundamentals of national defense-sector governance and informs participants to achieve peak performance in their current duties by increasing their understanding of the functions, management, and operations of defense governance, as well as key relationships across the defense sector.

Disaster Management Offered in sequence every May

MASL P170472 – Disaster Management

This course surveys contemporary topics, best practices, and emerging technologies relevant to disaster and emergency management life cycles, and their application to participants' own country challenges.

MASL P170475 – Civil-Military Coordination in Disaster Relief

This course focuses on developing the knowledge and process skills required to collaborate across sectors and respond more effectively to domestic and global disasters.

Conflict Recovery Offered in sequence every August

MASL P171063 – Reintegration of Ex-Combatants & Violent Extremists

This course details how rebel fighters and ideological warriors, such as jihadists, can be drawn out of conflict through information operations, defection, amnesties, and settlements. The course also elaborates the methods for de-radicalizing and reintegrating such ex-fighters into society.

MASL P173019 – Security Risks of Refugees & Displaced Persons

This course engages participants to explore how host nations prepare for, respond to, and work together with key stakeholders to manage and overcome security challenges caused by the various types displacement (migrants; internally displaced persons; asylum seekers/refugees; etc.)

Conflict Management Offered every November

MASL P170030 – Managing Ethnic Conflict & Religious Violence

This course is a primer on what causes ethnic and religious violence. It covers prevention and recovery topics, and readies participants to practically apply conflict analysis, management, and resolution techniques. Offered every November or December
