Dr. Guy Ziv is an assistant professor at American University's School of International Service (SIS), where he teaches courses on foreign policy decision-making, U.S. foreign policy, the Middle East, and international negotiations. He is the author of *Why Hawks Become Doves: Shimon Peres and Foreign Policy Change in Israel*, published by SUNY Press in 2014, with an updated paperback version published in 2015. He also is Founder and Director of the Israel National Security Project (INSP), a repository of statements by Israeli security experts concerning the strategic imperative of a

two-state solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. His two current research projects include a focus on the growing rift between the Israeli security and political establishments, as well the influence of think tanks on U.S. foreign policy. Ziv has a background in policy, having worked on Capitol Hill and for Israel Policy Forum, a not-for-profit, nonpartisan organization that promotes American efforts aimed at resolving the conflict between Israel and its Arab neighbors. His articles have been published in peer-reviewed academic journals, blogs, and newspapers, including *The Baltimore Sun, CNN.com, Haaretz, The Hill, The Jerusalem Post, Newsday, The Philadelphia Inquirer*, and USA Today.
