Subj: MISSION OF THE DIRECTORATE FOR SAFETY HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL NAVAL POSTGRADUATE SCHOOL

1. This memorandum is to be used as interim policy until the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) safety instruction can be updated in the summer of 2016.

2. Mission:

- a. <u>US Navy</u>: The mission of the Navy is to maintain, train and equip combat-ready Naval forces capable of winning wars, deterring aggression and maintaining freedom of the seas.
- b. Naval Postgraduate School: The mission of NPS is to provide relevant and unique advanced education and research programs to increase the combat effectiveness of commissioned officers of the Naval Service to enhance the security of the United States. - c. Directorate for Safety, Health, and Environmental support of NPS mission: <u>Academic and research readiness</u>. It is the mission of NPS Safety Directorate to save lives and provide academic and research readiness, through risk identification and mitigation.
